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OIG Finds MCPD Executive Violated County Code and Department Policy

Rockville, Maryland – Montgomery County Inspector General Megan Davey Limarzi announced today the release of a new report, [*Public Synopsis, Investigation of Alleged Misconduct by a Montgomery County Police Department \(MCPD\) Executive*](#), detailing findings of an OIG investigation related to allegations of misconduct by an MCPD executive. The investigation was initiated pursuant to complaints received through the OIG's hotline.

The OIG found that between July 2024 and July 2026, the executive did not record any leave despite being absent from the office on several occasions. The investigation confirmed at least five days (totaling 40 hours) during which the executive was unavailable for work without taking leave or otherwise adjusting their work schedule, including attending a golf tournament where they consumed alcohol. While the executive is exempt from County Personnel Regulations due to their position, their actions violated MCPD policy prohibiting employees from being absent without leave.

The investigation also substantiated that the executive selected their County-employed relative to accompany them to a work-related conference, despite denying involvement in that decision to the OIG. Providing false information during an OIG investigation is a violation of Section 2-151(m)(2) of the County Code.

Additionally, the OIG determined that the executive directed that a County vehicle be provided to an Office of the County Attorney employee without establishing appropriate usage parameters. The vehicle was subsequently used for personal matters and for commuting between home and work without the approval required by County policy.

The OIG's review also identified broader issues within MCPD, including inconsistent supervisory review of timecards and confusion among executives and managers regarding requirements for taking leave when attending non-official events during the workday. The report presented five recommendations for improvement.

The OIG Provided the County's Chief Administrative Officer with a confidential version of the full Memorandum of Investigation on September 17, 2026, and received assurances that appropriate action would be taken.
